ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN SECONDARY SCIENCE TEACHING**

Dr. Dewey D. Davis, Professor Emeritus, Division of Education, and his wife, Ruth M. Davis, established this scholarship because of their commitment to education and to UTSA. Professor Davis was on the faculty from 1971 until 1986, and was awarded the title of emeritus in 1988. The Davis family hopes to set an example for other faculty members to follow.

To be eligible for this scholarship you must meet the following requirements:

- Must be **clinical teaching** during the semester for which this scholarship is awarded.
- Must be enrolled for at least 12 hours at The University of Texas at San Antonio as an undergraduate student. (*Full-time enrollment requirement is waived for the Clinical teaching semester.*)
- Must be actively pursuing a certificate in Secondary (High School) Science teaching.
