- The full-time enrollment requirement is automatically waived for students who will be either student teaching, completing their last semester of required coursework, or

This interest led her into work-study programs for potential dropouts in high school, a developmental reading program in middle school and the Reading Recovery teacher program in elementary school. Carol received her Reading Recovery teacher leader certification from Texas Woman's University, Denton, Texas. With this training, she became a curriculum specialist in SAISD, training Reading Recovery teachers through UTSA. Later, she developed her own educational consultant firm and became a national presenter, training superintendents, principals, curriculum specialists and teachers throughout the United States.

Carol met her husband, R. Edward Dodge, M.D., in the spring of 1999. Since their marriage, they have traveled extensively throughout Europe, China, South America, and the United States. Ed and Carol are both committed to projects that help people help themselves. It is their hope that the recipients of these scholarships will also give back to their community in some special way.
