Mr. Hernandez currently teaches Technology Applications at Mark Twain Dual Language Academy. He is a fourth-year doctoral student at The University of Texas at San Antonio in the Department of Interdisciplinary Teaching and Learning with a focus on EC-6 education, learning design, and technology. After a month of teaching, his middle school students have already been introduced to several skills and applications. Recently, his students were introduced Scratch, a coding language developed at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology that allows young coders to develop games and projects. He supports students' biliteracy development by not only encouraging them to present in Spanish but also encouraging the use of technology to pursue their language interests.

Mr. Hernandez is also integrating his passion for education and technology through his research. His dissertation will investigate the ways that children learn social skills, such as collaboration, while playing Roblox. In addition to teaching at Mark Twain, Mr. Hernandez is an active community leader and UTSA student advocate. His student and academic leadership include his service as a Graduate Student Senator in UTSA's Student Government Association and Co-Chair for a special interest group in the Society for Information Technology and Teacher Education. His public leadership includes his current role as a trustee for the Edgewood Independent School District.
