# **UEI Project Updates**

### PROJECTS:

We are continuing our partnership with the City of San Antonio to evaluate its ambitious **Ready to Work** program. This program offers comprehensive job training that includes case management and employer engagement, helping San Antonio citizens climb the economic ladder. We have also formed a new partnership with **Celebrate Dyslexia** to explore educational pathways for students experiencing dyslexia. Additionally, we have partnered with **UP Partnership** to enhance the quality and scope of counseling services for students in San Antonio, promoting foundational knowledge, ambition, and pathways to success in both secondary and postsecondary education. Lastly, UEI has collaborated with faculty and researchers from three institutions—the University of Texas at El Paso, Texas Tech University, and E3 Alliance—to study access, equity, and the impact of Texas's **dual credit** program.

We are grateful for the generous funding from our supporters, including the City of San Antonio, Celebrate Dyslexia, UP Partnership, the University of Texas at Austin, and the Gates Foundation, which enable these research opportunities.

#### **COMMUNITY UPDATE:**

We have had a follow-up meeting of our newly formed "Quant Group."
