Head Start is a national program that provides education and comprehensive child development services for low-income, preschool children ages 3 to 5 and social services for their families. Participants receive comprehensive child development services— education, health, nutrition, and mental health—and social services. Early Head Start assists low-income families with infants and toddlers, including children with disabilities, and pregnant women and their families. Participants receive the same comprehensive child development services as Head Start families. Some programs provide homebased services to pregnant women and families with infants and toddlers. The Health Advisory Committee plays an important role in weaving community connections and ensuring that Head Start programs provide comprehensive, integrated, and effective health services to children and their families. Head Start programs place an emphasis on partnerships with local providers to connect families to medical and dental homes in their communities. These partnerships enable Head Start to respond to changes in the health-care delivery system.
